* Spicebush	<i>Lindera benzoin</i>	Shrub	Sun Part Shade Shade	April-May, Fall Fruit	Birds Butterflies	Up to 15
Black-eyed Susan²	<i>Rudbeckia hirta</i>	Annual Perennial Biennial	Sun	June- September, Fall Seeds	Birds Butterflies	Up to 3
Switchgrass	<i>Panicum virgatum</i>	Grass/Grass-like	Sun Part Shade	August- November, Fall Seeds	Birds Butterflies	Up to 10, often shorter
